School History and Beliefs

The First Baptist Church of Oldsmar started our school in 1980, because recognized the need for a Christian-based education, in a safe and caring environment.

Our 6th – 12th Grades

Our 6th – 12th grade students are kept engaged by the challenging A Beka curriculum. However, we use Saxon mathematics for our 5th – 12th grade students. We have found this particular mathematics program very effective, with its continual review system. Our academics are college preparatory.

We provide a well-rounded athletic program for our 6th – 12th grades. We offer volleyball, basketball, fast pitch softball and cheerleading, to our girls; golf, basketball, and baseball to our boys. We are members in good standing with the Florida High School Activities Association.

We have a full academic schedule with extras like music, drama, chorus, computer, and dual enrollment for juniors and seniors.

Our Kindergarten and Elementary

We have a very fine kindergarten 4 through 5th grade program. We accept children in the K4 & K5 program as long as they turn either 4 or 5, respectively, by the start of the school year. Our kindergarten students are reading books and writing in cursive when they leave K5.

We use "phonics" to teach reading. These skills are also repeated through the 3rd grade. Our elementary students present an annual Christmas program.

The weekly schedule includes art, computer literacy, P.E., and music. We also schedule field trips on a regular basis.
